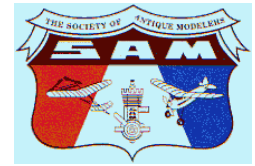

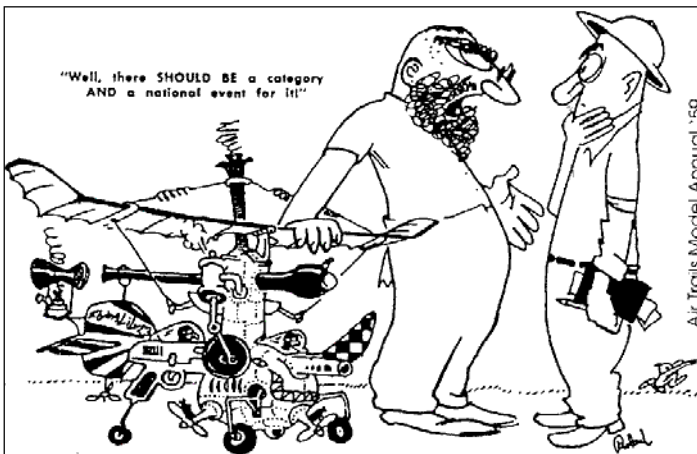

Altitude Limited Special Event Proposed For 2013 SAM Champs

After a considerable amount of discussion between several interested parties, including your editor, and sparked by an RC Matters column written by Bob Angel (see below), subject to final approval of the SAM Champs RC CD, a Special Event based on the altitude limiting software currently available will be included in events to be contested at the 2013 SAM Champs. A sponsor has already been secured to underwrite expenses of the event and at least one "event manager" has volunteered for 'on site' duty.

The event is to be held to measure the effect, whether positive or negative, of increasing overall participation by adding two basic elements to SAM competition: 1) Level the 'playing field' for all methods of power and; 2) Eliminating (for the most part) the "best eyes win" element.

The event planned for the SAM Champs is simplified to it's most basic elements: Two classes, small and large (see rules below) and any model/any power for any SAM legal model(s) using current SAM power and wing loading constraints only.

It is hoped that the proposed event will encourage use of obscure but interesting approved SAM designs, encourage the use of more currently 'handicapped' engines and motor/battery combinations, and provide access to interesting and relatively sedate competition to attract many more SAM modelers and perhaps, attract new ones ...

RC MATTERS: Altitude Limiting (AL) Event. By Bob Angel

ALES is the acronym for AMA's relatively new Altitude Limited Electric Soaring event which was made possible by the introduction of the Sky Limit device from Winged Shadow systems. The small lightweight (4 grams) Sky Limit can be set to shut off an engine or electric motor at any pre set altitude. Bill Copeland from SAM 21 and myself from SAM 26 have been doing some testing and are planning to try out a special SAM RC event using the device.

I'm seldom enthusiastic about another special event, but I can see lots of possibilities for this one. The primary asset could be the introduction of some new faces attending and flying in SAM contests or fun fly events. It would be a nice alternative for those who are either put off by the high powered LER events, or whose eyesight is becoming a limiting factor. It would reduce the occasional aircraft losses while allowing a greater range of less powerful and often more interesting engines to compete effectively.

We could set a reasonable altitude for engine or motor shutdown which would be lower than the generally eye straining heights now being achieved with the hotter engines. Even muffled RC engines could compete effectively, yet also be flown at "back and forth" RC fields, possibly attracting some new OT enthusiasts. Electric motors could finally compete fairly with glow engines.

The event can be flown with existing ships. It would be convenient, but not at all necessary, that an entrant buy and install his own AL device, as contest management could keep a few spares. If you wanted to use a contest provided unit, here's how you'd set your ship up. The unit needs to be plugged in between the throttle channel on the receiver, and either the throttle servo, transistorized ignition unit, or the ESC. It has a standard male servo connector on one end and a female on the other, just like an aileron extension cord.

It's not usually easy to unplug from the receiver in the field, so here's your best bet. Get an aileron extension cord and plug it into the RX throttle channel. For normal flying just plug the servo or transistor unit into the extension. Then, to use the Sky Limit, just unplug the extension and plug the Sky Limit in between. Altitude is selected with a plug in programmer. Only one programmer would be needed at an event, because once set, the unit stays set for cutoff at that altitude until changed.

A side benefit for ignition engines is that the AL unit can be set to protect your coil from getting fried if you forget to switch off after engine cutoff. Once the unit shuts off at altitude, the coil can't be reenergized regardless of throttle stick position.

Another interesting feature is that you can plug in the programmer after a flight and read the max altitude achieved after you caught that nice thermal.

PROPOSED RULES FOR ALTITUDE LIMITED EVENT:

1. Basic SAM rules for LER type events will be followed, to include the 10 Oz. wing loading, the 225 sq. in. power loading, construction and propeller specifications, design dates, engine and fuel specifications, one entry per flier, one flier per airplane, etc, etc.
2. **Two classes, large and small** are defined by maximum plan form wingspan limitations of 72 inches maximum, and 96 inches maximum, respectively. Scaling is allowed.
3. Any SAM legal engine or electric motor may be used.
4. All models will incorporate the use of the "Sky Limit" Altitude Limiting device which will be either programmed or verified by contest management prior to first flight. A suggested altitude limit is 800', but may be altered by event director based on experience or other conditions. Flight time starts at engine or motor cutoff.
5. A total of the best two of four allowed flights will be scored. Max flight time: 10 minutes.

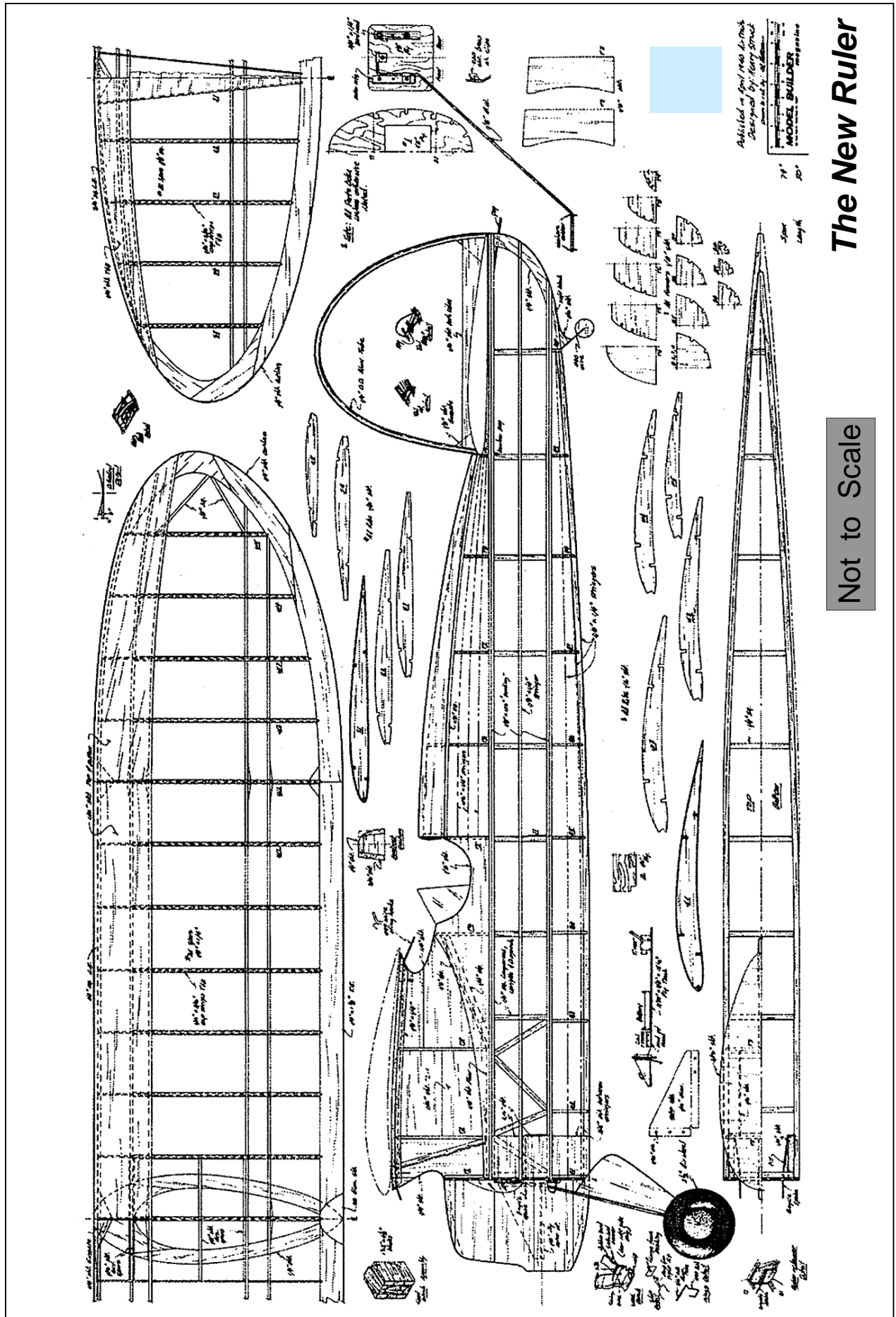

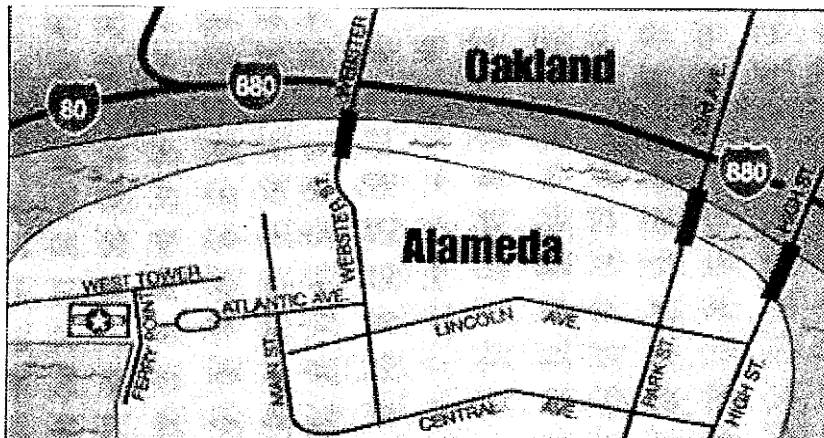
